IASB invites nominations for users of financial statements to join

insurance working group

The International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) calls for nominations for one or two

users of financial statements to join its insurance working group.

The IASB established the insurance working group in 2004 to provide it with advice for its

project on insurance contracts. The members of the group are senior financial executives of

insurers, analysts, actuaries, auditors and regulators, and are listed here.

To obtain direct input from a wider range of analysts or other users of insurers' financial

statements, the IASB now wishes to add one or two more users to the working group.

The IASB emphasises that members of its working groups are unpaid volunteers and that it

does not reimburse travel and other expenses.

Nominations:

Candidates should have practical experience of using and interpreting financial information

produced by insurers.

Because the project is a comprehensive review of the current accounting for insurance

contracts, the IASB expects members of the working group to be willing to set aside their

existing views or practices in favour of working towards improved financial reporting. The

IASB can learn from national or industry practice, but will also consider other options. The

IASB's goal is a workable standard that is conceptually grounded and principle-based.

Fluency in English is necessary as all correspondence, documents and discussions are in

English.

The IASB staff expects to seek help from working group members as necessary in various

ways (for example, through emails, video conferences and meetings with the group or sub-

groups). The number and timing of meetings will depend on the progress of the project. As

an indication, the staff might ask the full working group to meet perhaps twice a year in

2008-2010, starting with a two day meeting in London in March or April 2008 to discuss

comments received on its discussion paper Preliminary Views on Insurance Contracts,

published in May 2007 with a comment deadline of 16 November.

Nominations should include a short biography and be sent to Peter Clark (senior Project Manager), to arrive by **30 October 2007**.
